10 Point Summary

1. The Modh Ordaitheach is used to give orders to people.
2. We use the root of the verb for the Modh Ordaitheach.
3. To give orders to more than one person, here are the rules:

	Broad	Slender
One syllable	root + aígí (seasaígí)	root + ígí (brisígí)
Two syllable	root + aígí (ceannaígí)	root + ígí (bailígí)

4. For one syllable verbs that end with -áil or -áin, we drop the 'i' and use the appropriate ending for more than one person.
5. In one syllable verbs that end with -igh, we replace with this with 'ígí' for more than one person.
6. For two syllable verbs that end with -(a)il, -(a)in, -(a)ir or (a)is, we drop the -ai or -i part and replace it with 'aígí' or 'ígí'... for example ceangail - ceanglaígí.
