- 1. We use the bunuimhreacha to count nouns that are not people.
- 2. We use the nouns in their singular form following the Bunuimhreacha.
- 3. The numbers from 1-10 go as follows:

| Number | Consonant | Vowel | |
|-----------|-----------|---------|--|
| 1 Aon | séimhiú | nothing | |
| 2 Dhá | séimhiú | nothing | |
| 3 Trí | séimhiú | nothing | |
| 4 Ceithre | séimhiú | nothing | |
| 5 Cúig | séimhiú | nothing | |
| 6 Sé | séimhiú | nothing | |
| 7 Seacht | urú | n- | |
| 8 Ocht | urú | n- | |
| 9 Naoi | urú | n- | |
| 10 Deich | urú | n- | |

- 4. So just a quick recap on that...1-6 take a séimhiú...7-10 take an urú.
- 5. NOTE when the words "an" and "dhá" come together, the "dhá" loses the "h" and becomes "an dá".
- 6. NOW, when you move on to numbers bigger than ten, the structure is: "unit noun is ten" and no...that doesn't make sense so here's an example: 32 chairs = dhá chathaoir is tríocha
