



Irish Road Trip: The West Coast W.A.L.T: to compare life in other Irish counties to that in Dublin








Let's hop back in the car and head to our last stop on our road trip. Does anyone know what county we are visiting next?

We're heading to County Donegal! What do you already know about Donegal? Think, Pair, Share.

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

County Donegal is a coastal county in the North of Ireland. It is in the province of Ulster. Cork borders Leitrim in the Republic and Derry, Tyrone and Fermanagh in Northern Ireland. It shares a sea border with the Atlantic Ocean.

Most people live in Letterkenny. However there are other towns like Buncrana and Bundoran. You might have heard of some of the smaller towns too like: The Glenties and Lifford. The population in Donegal is a lot smaller than Dublin!





The landscape of Donegal is VERY different to that of the other counties in Ireland. The land is full of mountains, lakes, rivers and cliffs. The tallest mountain in Donegal is Mount Errigal.

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The Slieve League cliffs are some of the biggest sea cliffs in Europe! They are nearly 3 times as tall as the Cliffs of Moher in Clare. On a clear day, you can see all the way down to the mountains of Mayo! The Slieve League cliffs are a stop on the Wild Atlantic Way, a popular driving route along the west coast.





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Water sports are very popular in Donegal. Of all sports, surfing is the most important for Donegal. People travel to Donegal from all over the world to surf the waves off the coast. The waves are some of the best in Europe, reaching as high as 20 metres! The town of Bundoran is one of the most popular surf spots.

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Donegal is also home to some of the most beautiful and quiet beaches on the whole island of Ireland. Many of Donegal's beaches have won the 'Blue Flag Award'. This is given to beaches that are very clean and very beautiful. The only thing to be careful of is where you swim.
