The boy carefully built the Lego tower. It was so tall that it was nearly twice and big as he was!

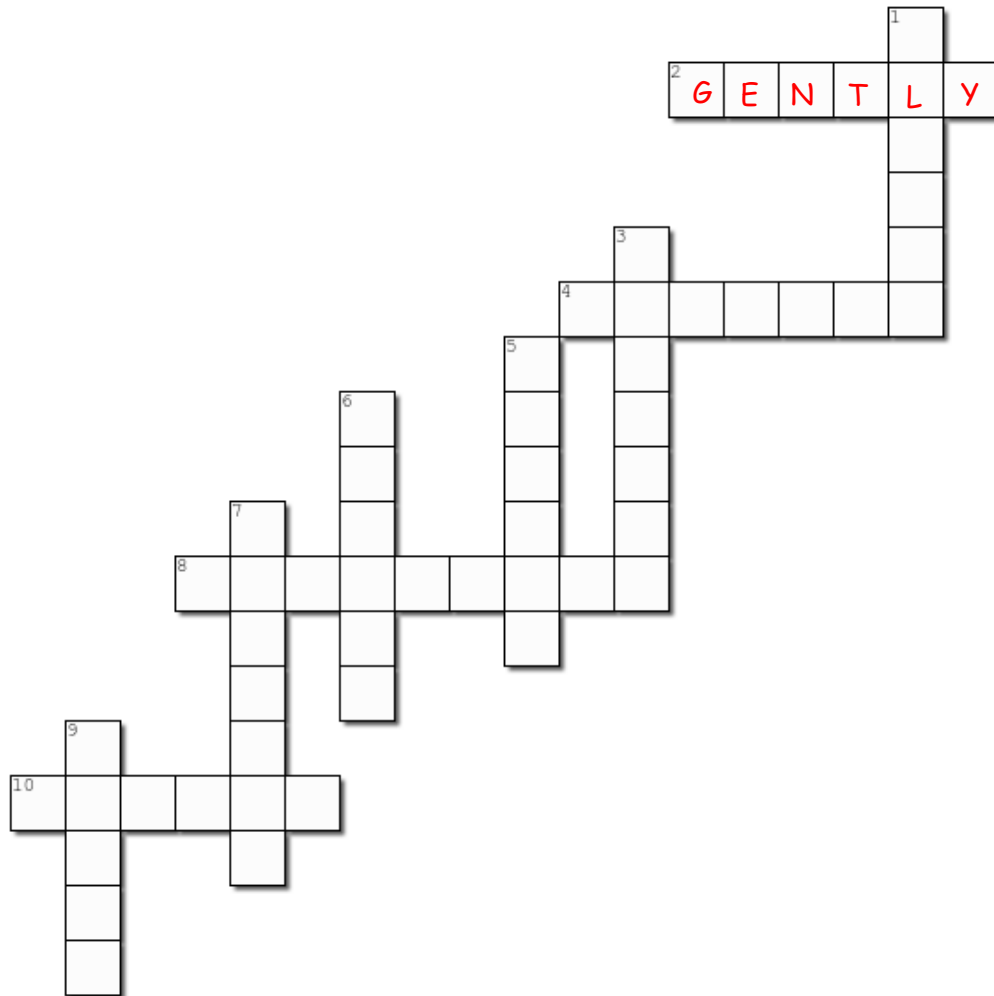
Laura went shopping with her granny and bought a new dress. When she got home she danced happily around her room.
